TOP FIVE LIST

In this section, we briefly list the top five "need to knows" for business educators right now. Some of them are elaborated upon later in the newsletter

- 1. January 2021 Regents cancelled: <u>The Regents examinations that were set to be</u> <u>administered in January 2021 have been cancelled</u>. At this point, no decision has been made about end-of-year assessments, including Approved Program Technical Assessments.
- 2. **Top business courses by enrollment in 2019-2020:** Data was recently made available on the status of business education in New York. There are close to 1100 business

teachers throughout the state. The top five courses, based on enrollment, are 1. Computer Applications, 2. Career and Financial Management, 3. Entrepreneurship, 4. Sports and Entertainment Marketing, and 5. Accounting.

- 3. **Importance of NYSED Program Approval:** If your school does not already have a NYSED-approved program in business, give some serious consideration to getting your program ready for future success. Approved programs allow students to graduate with a 4+1 CTE pathway, award a technical endorsement, and help to build the quality of your business department's efforts. For assistance in getting started, please contact the <u>Associate for Business and Marketing Education</u>.
- 4. Work-Based Learning Updates: Given the difficulty in securing on-site internships this year, schools have additional flexibility for work-based learning, including the use of remote or virtual internships. An effort must be provided to provide students in WBL programs with as comprehensive of an experience as possible. However, the reopening guidance allows for schools to use discretion if some of the hours in hour-based WBL programs cannot be met due to current circumstances.
- 5. Continued Updates for 2020-2021 School Year- As we navigate this school year, please check the NYSED COVID-19 web page for updates related to education throughout New York. The <u>Associate for Business and Marketing Education</u> will communicate directly any information that directly impacts business education programs.
