This can be done through one of the four registered programs (CEIP, Co-op, GEWEP, and WECEP), or through non-registered experiences (job shadowing, school-based enterprise, projects with business and industry, community service, etc.). All experiences must be supervised by appropriately certified staff.</p>
