This notice is to inform you that on May 15th, 2020 the New York State Board of Regents received three applications to establish a charter school within the City of Rochester. These applications are under review for possible action at the November 16-17, 2020 Board of Regents meeting. Full application materials may be viewed on or after Wednesday, June 17th at: http://www.p12.nysed.gov/psc/startcharter/StartCharter2020.html.

Please note that pursuant to Education Law section 2857(1) and 8 NYCRR 119.4 (available at <u>http://www.p12.nysed.gov/psc/publichearing.html</u>), the school district of location is required to hold a public hearing to solicit comments from the community relating to the foregoing applications. This hearing, which is required to be held within the community that is potentially impacted by the charter school, must be held within 30 days of your receipt of this letter.

Public hearing comments are generally due 45 days after receipt (or within 15 days of from the hearing) of this notice. However, given the COVID-19 pandemic, NYSED has provided additional flexibilities if needed to school districts required to conduct charter school public hearings. Those flexibilities allow for school districts, at their discretion, to hold charter school related public hearing remotely and to delay charter school public hearings until a date **no later than September 30, 2020**. Please provide the following required documentation:

- 1. A copy of the public hearing notice at the time of dissemination.
- 2. Written confirmation that the hearing was held no later than the next business day following the hearing.
- 3. Copies of all written records or comments generated from this hearing should be sent within 15 business days after the hearing. However, the Department would appreciate receiving the written records or comments no later than October 7, 2020.

All documentation listed above should be submitted electronically to <u>CharterSchools@nysed.gov</u> (the subject line of the email should include the NAME OF PROPOSED CHARTER SCHOOL *Public Hearing*).

In addition, Rochester City School District has the right to comment directly to the Board of Regents on the programmatic and fiscal impact of the proposed charter school on traditional public and non-public schools in your district. Comments should be submitted no later than **September 30, 2020** to <u>CharterSchools@nysed.gov</u> (the subject line of the email should read: *Rochester City School District response to* NAME OF PROPOSED CHARTER SCHOOL *application*).
