#### Background

Section 9-a of part A of chapter 56 of the laws of 2021, as amended by §5-a of part A of chapter 56 of the laws of 2022 requires, on or before July 1, 2022, <u>every</u> local educational agency (LEA) receiving funding from the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) funding from the American Rescue Plan (ARP) act of 2021 to post on its website and submit to the New York State Education Departent (NYSED) an updated plan of how such funds will be expended and how the LEA will prioritized spending on non-recurring expenses as defined in section 9-a(1) of part A of chapter 56 of the laws of 2021. #### Instructions

The State Budget Reporting Survey is due by July 1, 2022.

LEAs must complete all sections and are required to answer questions marked with a red asterisk. If a required question has not been completed, the business portal will highlight it in red and the section of the application will be flagged. The applicant will be unable to submit the application to NYSED for final review if a required question remains unresolved.

The online application may only be submitted/certified by the chief school officer of the applicant LEA. The designated superintendent (public school LEAs) or the chief executive officer, board of trustees president, or school employee designated by the board of trustees (charter school LEAs), are the only administrators with the submit/certify rights necessary to successfully submit and certify a completed application for NYSED review.

LEAs are NOT REQUIRED to send hard copies of survey materials to the Department.

Due to rising prices and the availability of materials, the District removed from our ARP budget the cost of constructing outdoor learning spaces. Instead, the District used the additional funds to hire additional intervention and support staff to work with our most at risk learners and special education population.

The overwhelming recommendations from the community, outside of outdoor learning spaces, were to use funding for additional learning time and additional staffing. Therefore, when the costs for creating outdoor spaces became prohibitive, the District added additional staffing. We currently do have funding allocated to both summer learning and school year tutoring programs in an effort to allow additional learning time. The Hammondsport CSD engaged a variety of stakeholders to develop the ARP plan to represent the best interests of students and staff. There has been positive feedback to the ARP plan posted on the District website.
