#### Background

administrators with the submit/certify rights necessary to successfully submit and certify a completed application for NYSED review.

In addition, this modification will also allow the District to better provide academic support services to students in grades 7-12. Teachers certified in each specific subject area will now be able to provide the services as needed to our students.

A few questions were posed at Board meetings and the District received a letter from our present 6th grade students regarding the change but no responses were received with regard to the use of the funding.

*OG training: Through our local BOCES, the district was able to participate in a six week Orton	
Gillingham training program focused on professional development for teachers in the OG methods and	
concepts. Teachers who were previously trained were able to participate in either refresher or extended	
OG training opportunities. 14 teacher, either classroom, special education, Rtl or AIS participated in the	
training program. All teachers began implementation of the OG concepts during this school year and
