Background

A 0.8 FTE school counselor position was added to the district with the goal of increasing social, emotional, and academic supports for elementary school students. The school counselor facilitates push-in SEL lessons using the second-step program, and was trained this school year in the RULER Approach. This position will be essential in launching the RULER Approach next school year, which will provide a Tier I social and emotional level of support for all students. The counselor is also tasked with providing individualized support to students who require Tier II and III supports for social, emotional and academic needs.	27,254.72
