Background

The applicant will be unable to submit the application to NYSED for final review if a required question remains unresolved.

The online application may only be submitted/certified by the chief school officer of the applicant LEA. The designated superintendent (public school LEAs) or the chief executive officer, board of trustees president, or school employee designated by the board of trustees (charter school LEAs), are the only administrators with the submit/certify rights necessary to successfully submit and certify a completed application for NYSED review.

A 0.6 counselor was hired through the CRRSA grant for our elementary school. The ARP enabled Rhinebeck CSD to make the counselor full-time to provide additional support in our middle school through the end of the grant. The prior counselor ratio at our elementary school was 1 : 384 and is now 1 : 240; and our middle school was 1 : 231 and is now 1 : 165.	198544
Fitness room is planned to be renovated this year. The space will be used to provide additional classroom experiences that aren't currently available. The space will also be used before and afterschool as a space for students to be physically active in a safe and secure manner.	86565
The redesign of the Library is happening during the upcoming school year. The goal is to make areas so that students can work collobratively in small groups. In addition to the redesign is keep the library open longer after school so that students have a place and employees for an additional hour after school.	145196
The addition of a FTE of 3.0 monitors enables the school to supervise students in various settings. Due to the pandemic our schools have been instituting new supervison methods to ensure that students aren't congregating and that social distancing is being practiced in the schools, lunch, and recess periods. The per pupil ratio before the grant was 1:64 and with the help of the grant it is currently 1:53.	183491
