## Background

Section 9-a of part A of chapter 56 of the laws of 2021, as amended by §5-a of part A of chapter 56 of the laws of 2022 requires, on or before July 1, 2022, <u>every</u> local educational agency (LEA) receiving funding from the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) funding from the American Rescue Plan (ARP) act of 2021 to post on its website and submit to the New York State Education Departent (NYSED) an updated plan of how such funds will be expended and how the LEA will prioritized spending on non-recurring expenses as defined in section 9-a(1) of part A of chapter 56 of the laws of 2021. This updated plan must include:

An analysis of public comment;

Goals and ratios for pupil support;

Detailed summaries of Investments in current year activities; and

Balance of funds spent in priority areas.

#### Instructions

The State Budget Reporting Survey is due by July 1, 2022.

LEAs must complete all sections and are required to answer questions marked with a red asterisk. If a required question has not been completed, the business portal will highlight it in red and the section of the application will be flagged. The applicant will be unable to submit the application to NYSED for final review if a required question remains unresolved.

The online application may only be submitted/certified by the chief school officer of the applicant LEA. The designated superintendent (public school LEAs) or the chief executive officer, board of trustees president, or school employee designated by the board of trustees (charter school LEAs), are the only administrators with the submit/certify rights necessary to successfully submit and certify a completed application for NYSED review.

LEAs are NOT REQUIRED to send hard copies of survey materials to the Department.

Since the district reviewed and posted the district's ARP plan in August 2021, there have been several opportunities for public comment during the 2021-2022 school year. On November 3, 2021 the ARP plan updates were shared with the public and board during the board of education meeting. On December 1, 2022 the ARP plan was reviewed with the public and board during the board of education meeting. Through feedback from staff and the community, the district began exploring options for changes to the approved ARP grant. The addition of an SRO was initially presented and discussed on February 2, 2022 at the budget public forum. Public feedback on this item as well as other additions to the grant were discussed at board of education public meetings on March 2, 2022, April 16, 2022, and May 9, 2022 (the budget hearing). Changes the district looks to submit budget amendments for in the summer of 2022 were discussed at the May 17, 2022 board meeting (budget vote night). All changes that were discussed will be ones that the district will incorporate in the final changes sent to the state for approval in the coming months. To date no changes have been made, however the district is in the planning stages to make changes to the ARP grant. No negative or additional comments were received from the public. The updated allocation distributions will be posted on the district website and were discussed in a public board meeting on June 8, 2022.
