Background

Section 9-a of part A of chapter 56 of the laws of 2021, as amended by §5-a of part A of chapter 56 of the laws of 2022 requires, on or before July 1, 2022, <u>every</u> local educational agency (LEA) receiving funding from the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) funding from the American Rescue Plan (ARP) act of 2021 to post on its website and submit to the New York State Education Departent (NYSED) an updated plan of how such funds will be expended and how the LEA will prioritized spending on non-recurring expenses as defined in section 9-a(1) of part A of chapter 56 of the laws of 2021. This updated plan must include:

An analysis of public comment;

Goals and ratios for pupil support;

Detailed summaries of Investments in current year activities; and

Balance of funds spent in priority areas.

Instructions

The State Budget Reporting Survey is due by July 1, 2022.

LEAs must complete all sections and are required to answer questions marked with a red asterisk. If a required question has not been completed, the business portal will highlight it in red and the section of the application will be flagged. The applicant will be unable to submit the application to NYSED for final review if a required question remains unresolved.

The online application may only be submitted/certified by the chief school officer of the applicant LEA. The designated superintendent (public school LEAs)

or the chief executive officer, board of trustees president, or school employee designated by the board of trustees (charter school LEAs), are the only

administrators with the submit/certify rights necessary to successfully submit and certify a completed application for NYSED review.

LEAs are NOT REQUIRED to send hard copies of survey materials to the Department.

The district created a COVID-19 Response Team that met weekly starting in May 2019. It was represented by School Officials, District/Local Medical Personnel, Local Government Officials, School Staff and Parents. The Response Team focused on the areas of Health/Safety (physical and emotional), Delivery of Instruction (virtual and in person), Nutrition and Transportation. The Team initially surveyed the school community to assess needs and to gauge the District's current response to the pandemic. District Officials communicated the Response Plan to staff and the community via four digital Town Hall meetings. The Response Team continued to meet bi-weekly throuhgout the COVID-19 pandemic. In addition, in each of the last three years the district has sent out a familty engagment survey, a student voice survey, and a faculty and staff enagement survey. These surveys are used to monitor our plans and initiatives and to elitic feedback from all of our stakeholders.
