### Background

The online application may only be submitted/certified by the chief school officer of the applicant LEA. The designated superintendent (public school LEAs) or the chief executive officer, board of trustees president, or school employee designated by the board of trustees (charter school LEAs), are the only administrators with the submit/certify rights necessary to successfully submit and certify a completed application for NYSED review.

The district provided retention stipends to all staff employed during the June 15, 2022 payroll who were also employed during the 21-22 school year during the covid pandemic. The idea for these stipends came from research into what other states have been using ARP funding for. Providing additional financial support for staff who put in extra time and work beyond what was expected of them was something the district wanted to provide. The district also added a Summer Program Coordinator position. The district added a couple of summer camps which requires a coordinator to organize and run all of them at the same time. The additional camps for summer 2022 will address social emotional and academic needs of students as an effect of the pandemic.

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2. Please provide an analysis of public comment for the updated American Rescue Plan (ARP) - Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) funding.

The district held four different stakeholder meetings in March and April of 2022. On Tuesday, March 15, the district held a meeting for 7-12 staff from 2:45 - 3:30 and a meeting for K-6 staff from 3:45 - 4:30. On Wednesday, March 23, the district held a meeting with the administrative staff from 3:45 - 4:30. On Monday, April 4, the district held a public meeting, which was recorded and posted on the Cortland Voice Website, from 5 - 6pm. The presentation for this meeting to gather feedback about the ARP plan is posted on the district website in the same location as all other required postings about ARP spending.

From these meetings, we obtained feedback on using the funding for providing additional supports for both students and staff (social workers, guidance counselors, teacher aides, psychologists, academic support staff). It was also discussed that the funds could be used to replace outdated furniture for students (tables, desks, chairs) which would be easier to clean. The community and staff members indicated they would like the district to continue with its other plans for curriculum enrichment and technology enhancements.

The district is planning on using the summer of 2022 to continue to review this feedback and make adjustments before the start of the next school year. We plan on setting up another round of similar meetings in September and October of 2022.
