Background

Section 9-a of part A of chapter 56 of the laws of 2021, as amended by §5-a of part A of chapter 56 of the laws of 2022 requires, on or before July 1, 2022, <u>every</u> local educational agency (LEA) receiving funding from the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) funding from the American Rescue Plan (ARP) act of 2021 to post on its website and submit to the New York State Education Departent (NYSED) an updated plan of how such funds will be expended and how the LEA will prioritized spending on non-recurring expenses as defined in section 9-a(1) of part A of chapter 56 of the laws of 2021. Instructions

The State Budget Reporting Survey is due by July 1, 2022.

LEAs must complete all sections and are required to answer questions marked with a red asterisk. If a required question has not been completed, the business portal will highlight it in red and the section of the application will be flagged. The applicant will be unable to submit the application to NYSED for final review if a required question remains unresolved.

The online application may only be submitted/certified by the chief school officer of the applicant LEA. The designated superintendent (public school LEAs)

or the chief executive officer, board of trustees president, or school employee designated by the board of trustees (charter school LEAs), are the only

administrators with the submit/certify rights necessary to successfully submit and certify a completed application for NYSED review.

LEAs are NOT REQUIRED to send hard copies of survey materials to the Department.

1a. Please provide a summary of those changes and the need informing those changes.

Due to the increased demand on our four registered nursing staff members and our administrative assistant who is in charge of daily covid reporting, one-time stipends in the amount of \$3,000 were issued to each of these five folks. These funds were available due to not hiring an extra IT position this year, so the funding in budget code of Support Staff Salaries will not change. In addition, the coordinator position (grants, accountability, safety, compliance, etc.) and the registered nurse position were both filled mid-year. The allocation of unused funds from those positions will be influenced by public input during summer community meetings around grant planning, at which time appropriate amendments will be submitted for approval.

2. Please provide an analysis of public comment for the updated American Rescue Plan (ARP) - Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) funding.

The District's plan was shaped by feedback collected from stakeholders (parents, teachers, students, community members, etc.) through a survey and meetings over a period of several months. Stakeholders responded in the survey that all general categories (safety/security, ed tech, enrichment, summer school, after-school academy, additional AIS, SEL support, additional early education, and HVAC) were of high importance. Additional comments provided specific ideas that either supported the above general areas or provided other suggestions, some allowed by the grant and others not. The responses overall prioritized academics (learning loss, acceleration, and enrichment), SEL, and safety, which the District recognized and met in the creation of their plan. We continue to gather input through Board of Education meetings, school events, and community events. As substantive revisions are made to the plan, we will formally solicit public comment.

Learning Loss Recovery by funding one middle school literacy interventionist, one extra elementary teacher, three summer school teacher assistants, and student materials and supplies for summer school. Interventionists and additional staff will target specific areas of need: literacy, smaller primary grade class size, and summer school staffing and materials for students for extended school year and credit recovery.	63:5
Continuation of Learning by funding one full-time substitute in each of the three school buildings. Building subs work full-time to be on call for staff absences in order to promote consistent and continued education, and are also utilized in downtime to provide extra support for students in need.	900:3
Acceleration and Enrichment by funding one elementary/middle school enrichment teacher, club stipends, and materials. An additional teacher will serve the elementary and middle school to provide enrichment opportunities for all students and accelerated learning for targeted students. In addition, compensation will be offered to staff who expand club offerings that support diverse interests and needs, promote exploration, and improve positive student connections with the school community and education. Funds are also allocated to support district-wide teacher requests for consumables and other materials that will benefit expansion of learning in their classrooms.	600:1
Mental and Physical Health through funding an additional elementary psychologist, an additional district- wide registered nurse, and stipends for registered nurses. Each added person brings each department staff up to 4 to serve our population of around 900. The psychologist provides full class, small group, and 1:1 programming and counseling and is able to ensure student access to appropriate needs. The additional RN supports each building in the elevated health needs due to covid. Each district nurse was also provided a one-time \$3,000 stipend to compensate for extra duties and time related to covid.	245:6

Operations through funding a Coordinator for Grant Funded Programming and Accountability, additional IT staff, and a daily covid reporter stipend. Funds are allocated to support school operations in the areas of: grant procurement and management, compliance, data protection, initiative integration, and software and hardware support to ensure smooth operations to meet the needs of students. A one-time stipend was also awarded to a staff member for the extra duty and time of providing daily covid reports to DOH, payroll, and other systems.	900:3
