PURPOSES of Title II, Part A

Title II, Part A of the *Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) of 2015* is intended to:

- Increase student achievement consistent with the challenging State academic standards;
- Improve the quality and effectiveness of teachers, principals, and other school leaders;
- Increase the number of teachers, principals, and other school leaders who are effective in improving student academic achievement in schools;
- Provide low-income and minority students greater access to effective teachers, principals, and other school leaders.

How does Title II, Part A reach these goals?...

FULFILLING the PURPOSES of Title II, Part A through PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Title II, Part A defines **Professional Development** as:

Activities that are **sustained, intensive, collaborative, job-embedded, data-driven, and classroom-focused.**

TITLE II-A FLEXIBILITIES FOR 2019-2020

- *What are the temporary flexibilities?*

Title II, Part A

Temporary Funding Flexibilities:

One hundred percent (100%) of unexpended Title II-A funds **allocated in 2018-19 and 2019-2020** can now be carried over and utilized until the end of 2020-2021.

Need to know:

Districts need only **submit an amendment** (FS-10A) to access NYSED Grants Finance Office final approved carryover funds.

For the 2020-2021 Consolidated Application, only budget your 2020–21 allocation, **do not include** any carryover.

PURPOSES of Title II, Part A Funds

Additional Flexibility:

In **2019-20** (up until August 31, 2020), USDE allows flexibility in the uses of Professional Development:

- LEAs can provide one-time, stand-alone, training to better meet the needs of teachers and students during school closures.
- As an example, districts may use one-time training (as appropriate) to provide instructional staff professional development on remote/distance and online learning skills, strategies, and techniques.
- Currently this flexibility is **not extended** through the 2020-2021 school year.

WHAT HAS NOT CHANGED with Title IIA?

Consultation/Collaboration:

Still necessary to **meet with stakeholders** (administrators, teachers, paraprofessionals, etc.) to discuss uses of Title II-A. **Includes parents!** (if appropriate, Community Partners, and Organizations with Demonstrated Expertise)

What Title II-A can be used for:

Consolidated Application lists **23*** different uses from *Instructional Coaching*, to *Rigorous Academic Content*, to *Supporting Children Affected by Trauma or Mental Illness*.

***Follow the “*Conditions of Use*” provided for every choice**

PURPOSES of Title II, Part A Funds

Still Required:

Equitable Services for in-district private schools:

- Per pupil calculation includes the private school's ***total enrollment***, regardless of the district of residence of the student
- Initial allocation amounts for services are discussed during the consultation phase with private schools ***accepting*** II-A services

PURPOSES of Title II, Part A Funds

Please Note: “To Be Determined” (TBD) is *no longer accepted* by Grants Finance on FS-10 budgets.

Title II, Part A Funds – IMPORTANT TO REMEMBER

Transferability

May transfer 100% or a portion of funding – may transfer *use of funds* for Title I-A or Title IV-A purposes.

Title II-A funds **stay in II-A code** (i.e. II-A FS-10).

Must consult with private schools prior to transfer.

Transferred funds must be **equitably shared** with private schools.

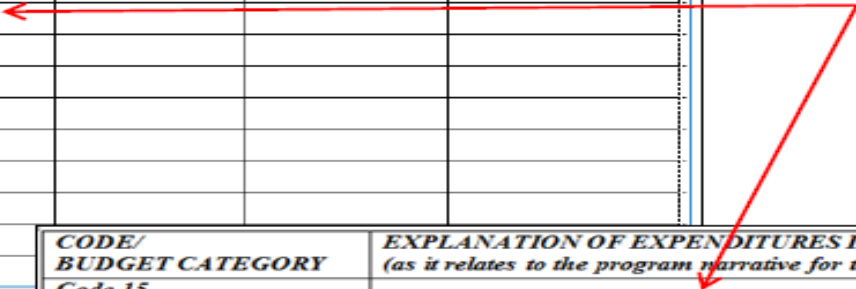
Transfer the “I-A and/or IV-A expense” and **pay** with II-A funds!
