


Introduction to Transferability

- Transferability is a flexibility authority under Section 5103 [20 U.S.C. 7305b] of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA).
- It allows Local Educational Agencies (LEAs) to transfer up to 100% of the funds they receive under <u>Title II, Part A and/or Title IV, Part A</u> to other programs to better address the needs of their unique student populations and to ensure the capacity of delivering a meaningful program.

Reasons for Transferability

- Transferability provides LEAs with flexibility in targeting Federal resources to meet the needs of all children.
- It can be a powerful tool in assisting districts in pursuing their own strategies for raising student achievement.
- It facilitates the development and implementation of integrated approaches for addressing local educational needs and priorities.

Transfers by LEAs

LEAs may transfer all or some of the funds received from:

- Title II, Part A Supporting effective instruction state grants
- Title IV, Part A Student support and academic enrichment grants

LEAs <u>cannot</u> transfer funds out of Title I, Parts A, C, or D, Title III, Part A, or Title V, Part B.

Eligible Programs to Accept Transfer of Funds

LEAs may transfer all or some of the funds from Title II, Part A and Title IV, Part A to:

- Title I, Part A Improving basic programs operated by LEAs
- Title I, Part C Education of migratory children
- Title I, Part D Neglected and delinquent education programs
- Title II, Part A Supporting effective instruction state grants
- **Title III, Part A** State grants for English language acquisition and language enhancement
- Title IV, Part A Student support and academic enrichment grants
- Title V, Part B Rural education

Requirements For Transferred Funds

- Funds that an LEA transfers are subject to the rules and requirements of the programs to which the use of funds are transferred.
- In transferring funds, an LEA transfers the use of funds, but does not actually have to move funds from one account to another so long as it maintains adequate documentation to account for the transfer.
- LEAs must complete FS-10 budgets for each project number.
- The LEA must maintain records demonstrating how a program's total funds, including transferred funds, were spent.

Prior to Transferring Funds

Before transferring funds from Title II, Part A and Title IV, Part A, an LEA must --

- 1. Engage in timely and meaningful consultations to provide for the equitable participation of private school students and staff;
- 2. Consult with required stakeholders for each program;
- 3. Assess Title IV, Part A needs (if transferring out of Title IV, Part A);
- 4. Determine the amount, and Federal fiscal year, of funds to be transferred;
- 5. As appropriate, reflect the use of transferability in the needs assessment and goals of each program impacted by the transfer; and
- 6. Notify NYSED of the transfer.

Impact of Transferability on Equitable Services

- Before an LEA may transfer funds from a program subject to equitable services requirements, it must engage in timely and meaningful consultation with appropriate private school officials.
- With respect to the transferred funds, the LEA must provide private school students and teachers equitable services under the program(s) to which, and from which, the funds are transferred, based on the total amount of funds available to each program after the transfer.
- The LEA may not transfer funds to a particular program solely to provide equitable services for private school students or teachers.

Impact of Transferred Funds on Title I, Part A

- The transferred funds need to be applied to the required set-asides (Homeless Reserve and Parent and Family Engagement)
- Since you are increasing your total allocation, this will also increase your funds for ranking and allocating to buildings under Title I, Part A.

Impact of Transferred Funds on Title IV, Part A

- If funds are transferred out of Title IV, Part A, resulting in an allocation decrease to below \$30,000 -
 - LEA still must complete a Comprehensive Needs Assessment once every three years.
 - LEA does not need to follow statutory spending requirements of 20/20/portion of.
- If funds are transferring into Title IV, Part A, resulting in an allocation increase to \$30,000 or more -
 - LEA must follow statutory spending requirements of 20/20/portion of.
- LEA must abide by 15% EUT special rule, regardless of allocation size.
- Carryover follows statutory spending requirements from fiscal year.




