



35 Years of Fulfilling Our Mission In Preventing Student Dropout



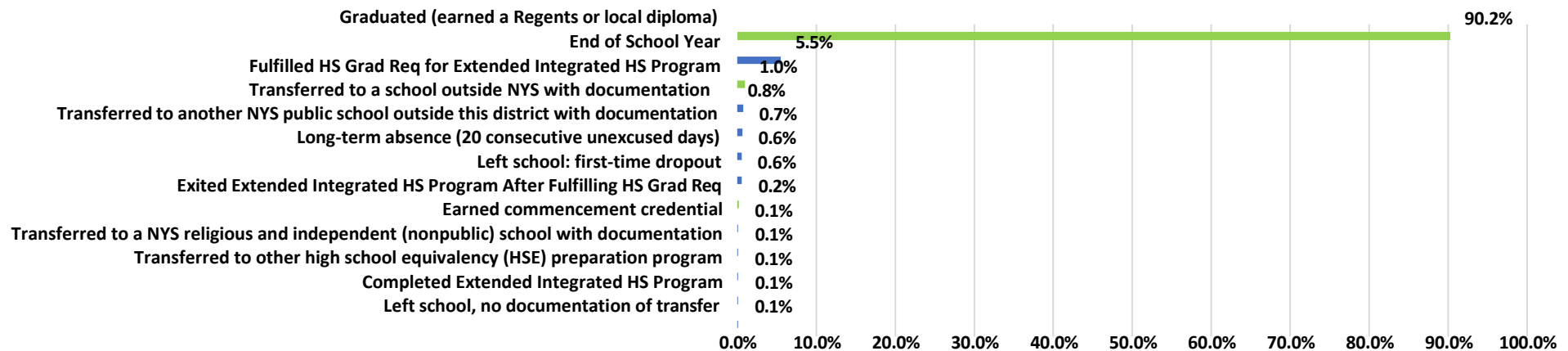
WHO WE ARE:

The Liberty Partnerships Program (LPP) was established in 1988 under Section 612, Subdivision 6 of the Education Law to address the significantly elevated, high school dropout rate among New York's youth. The authorizing legislation stated: "the failure of many young New Yorkers to complete their secondary education limited their opportunity for a life of fulfillment, prevents them from advancing into postsecondary education and hinders the State's efforts to provide a well-trained workforce for business and industry in New York."

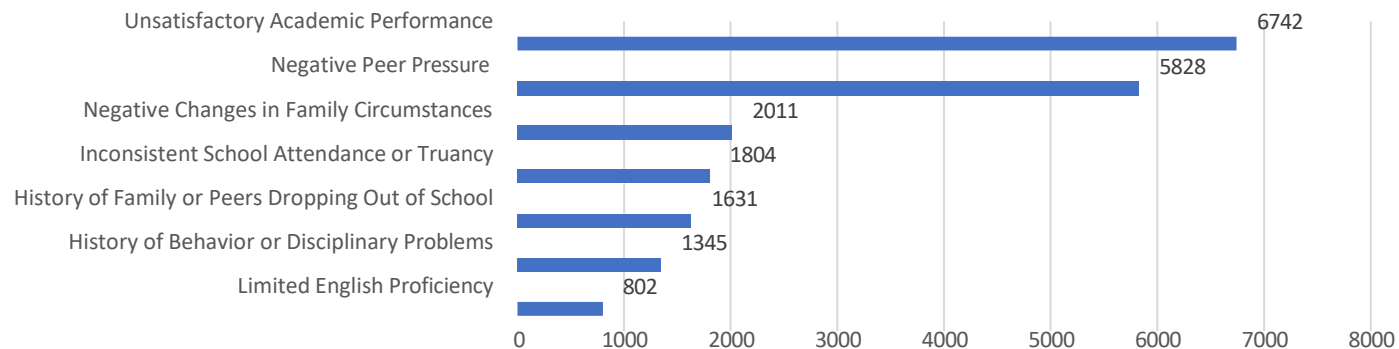
WHAT WE DO:

Liberty Partnerships Program's students receive a comprehensive pre-collegiate, dropout prevention program that aligns with their social-emotional learning needs. Each of the 51 LPP projects offers a variety of services to promote student achievement, improve high school graduation rates, and prepares students for post-secondary education and the 21st century workforce by ensuring equity of access. LPP projects are contracted to serve 14,797 students throughout New York State. Together, our LPP projects served approximately 15,000 students during 2021-2022.

91.4% GRADUATION RATE FOR GRADE 12 LPP STUDENTS: 2021-2022*



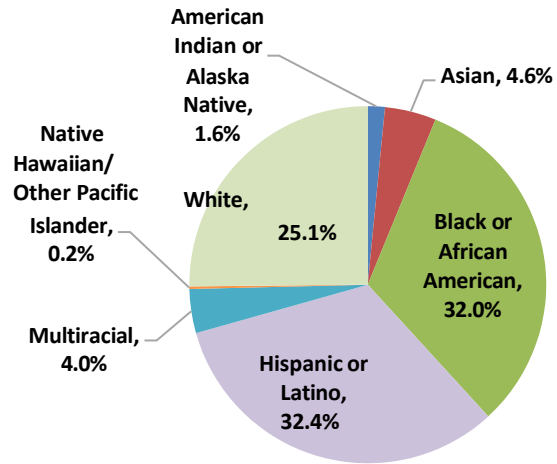
MOST COMMON REASONS STUDENTS WERE REFERRED TO LPP: 2021-2022*



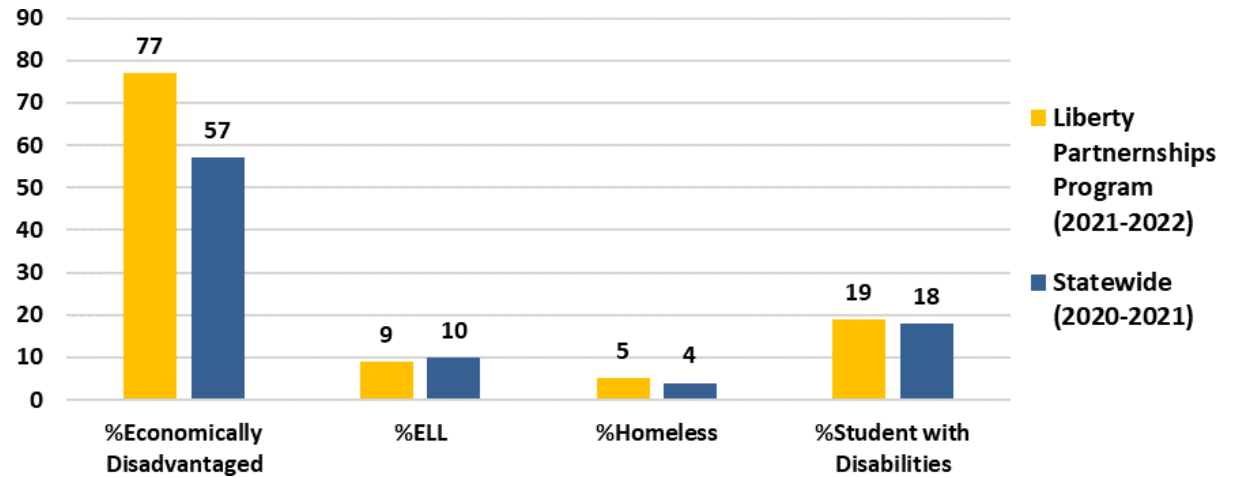
Most LPP students have more than one reason for referral

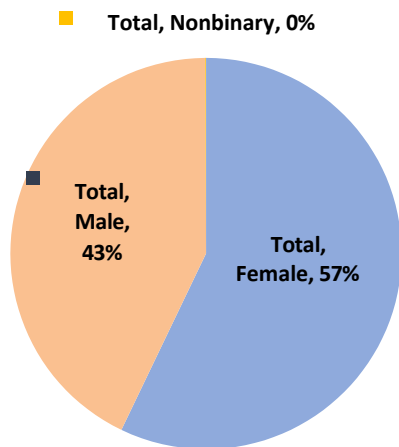
STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS: 2021-2022*



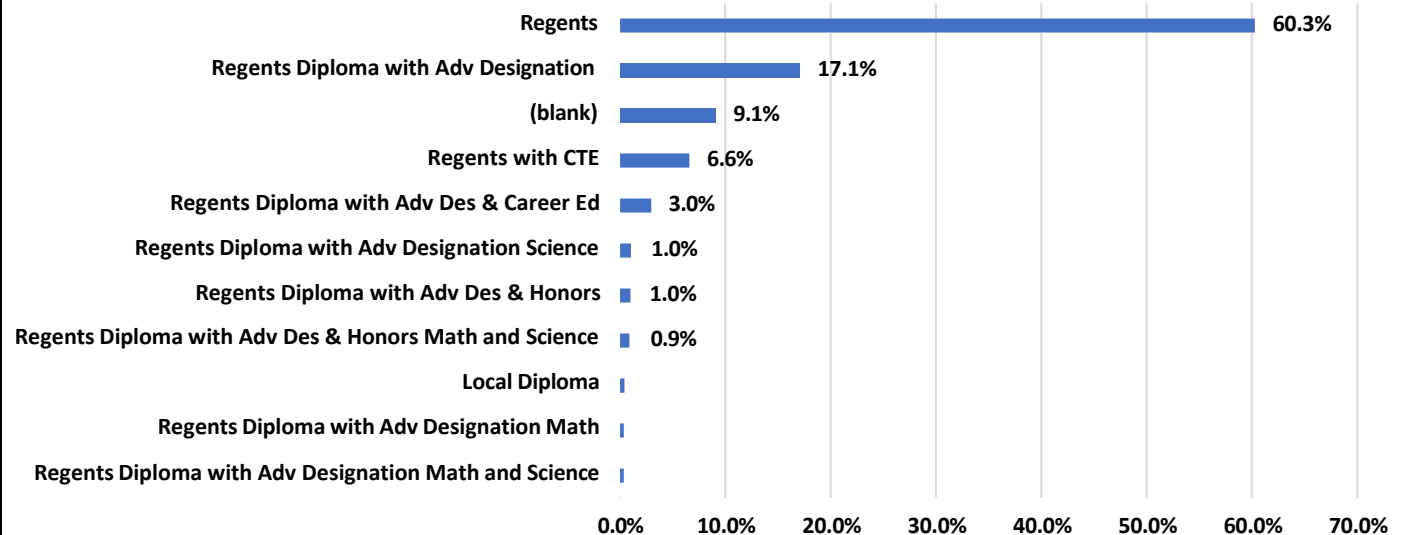
PERCENTAGE OF STUDENTS IN SUBGROUPS (LPP vs. STATEWIDE): 2021-2022*
