



## FACT SHEET: President Trump’s Proposed Budget is Detrimental for New York’s Children

President Trump’s budget proposes to slash funding education by \$9.2 billion (13.5 percent), which would result in more than \$433 million in cuts to New York programs. The severe cut will have far-reaching impacts across the nation, with life-shattering consequences for New York’s children, adults and communities, particularly those in economically disadvantaged situations. If these proposed cuts become reality, gaps and inequity in education will grow, eliminating the progress the Board of Regents and New York State Education Department worked so hard to gain. Vital community and arts programs would cease to exist, leaving voids in neighborhoods across the state.
