

Who We Are

The Liberty Partnerships Program (LPP) was established in 1988 under Section 612, Subdivision 6 of the Education Law to address the significantly elevated, high school dropout rate among New York's youth. The authorizing legislation stated: "The failure of many young New Yorkers to complete their secondary education limits their opportunity for a life of fulfillment, prevents them from advancing into postsecondary education and hinders the State's efforts to provide a well-trained workforce for business and industry in New York."


What We Do

Liberty Partnerships Program's students receive a comprehensive precollegiate, dropout prevention program that aligns with their socialemotional learning needs. Each of the 51 LPP projects offers a variety of services to promote student achievement, improve high school graduation rates, and prepares students for postsecondary education and the 21st century workforce by ensuring equity of access. Our LPP projects served more than 18,000 students during 2023-2024.



Other Year-End Outcomes for Grade 12 LPP Students

- End of School Year (10%)
- Transferred to another school out of district or state (1.5%)
- Long-term absence (20 consecutive unexcused days) (1.1%)
- Left school: first time, previous dropout, or no documentation of transfer (0.8%)
