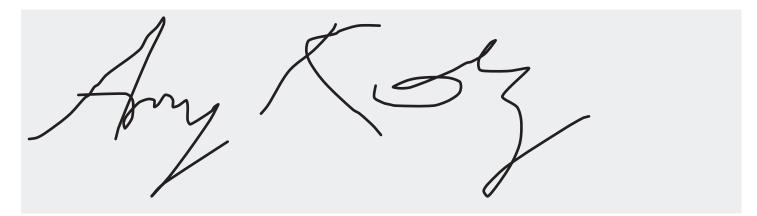

The Middle School utilizes reduced class sizes, with an average of 12-15 students per class. In doing this, every child receives more individual attention and support that is tapered to their specific academic and socialemotional needs. In Integrated Classrooms, our students at the Middle School receive instruction at about a 1:6 teacher to student ratio. This maximizes differentiation and student learning. In addition, we have an Intervention Specialist who works with students in small groups of six students or less for more targeted math instruction. At both campuses, our Family Engagement Coordinators have been readily available as a resource to families who may need referrals for services outside of the school environment.
