How to use these videos in professional learning

This collection of videos presents some of the ways in which different schools and districts across the state of New York are leading initiatives and activities related to implementing culturally responsive-sustaining education. The videos may support professional learning for individuals or in a group setting. Facilitators can consider using the questions below to guide full-group discussions about the ideas or strategies presented in the videos.

Viewing questions

The following questions can be used as a starting point to help structure your own reflection and to prepare for a group discussion. Viewers can review the questions before watching the videos and write responses after viewing to make connections to their own school contexts.

1. **MAKING MEANING.** What messages or ideas related to culturally responsive-sustaining education stood out to you?
2. **CONNECT.** Which moments in this presentation captured your attention? What are connections from this presentation to your own school community?
3. **EXTEND.** Which ideas or strategies shared in this presentation could positively impact your school or district community? In what ways do you see those ideas or strategies making an impact?
4. **CHALLENGE.** What questions arise for you? What challenges might arise when implementing these ideas or strategies?
5. **NEXT STEPS.** What, if any, action steps do you want to take now? If there is a strategy or idea that you would implement, how would you know it worked?
