- **A.** Currently, there is no recommended amount of time for uninterrupted play. However, play-based learning is unique and can be utilized with any instructional method or classroom activity.
- Q. Will the Office of Early Learning work with the Office of Assessment to make suggestions for how to best spend our 5 hours?
- A. In New York State, neither office dictates curricula nor how to organize the instructional day as those are local decisions. The Office of Early Learning (OEL) recommends a balance of teacher-directed and child-initiated play, indoor and outdoor gross motor activities, and individual and small group activities.
