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Background and Instructions**Background**

Section 9-a of part A of chapter 56 of the laws of 2021, as amended by §5-a of part A of chapter 56 of the laws of 2022 requires, on or before July 1, 2022, every local educational agency (LEA) receiving funding from the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) funding from the American Rescue Plan (ARP) act of 2021 to post on its website and submit to the New York State Education Department (NYSED) an updated plan of how such funds will be expended and how the LEA will prioritize spending on non-recurring expenses as defined in section 9-a(1) of part A of chapter 56 of the laws of 2021. This updated plan must include:

- An analysis of public comment;
- Goals and ratios for pupil support;
- Detailed summaries of Investments in current year activities; and
- Balance of funds spent in priority areas.

Instructions

The *State Budget Reporting Survey* is due by July 1, 2022.

LEAs must complete all sections and are required to answer questions marked with a red asterisk. If a required question has not been completed, the business portal will highlight it in red and the section of the application will be flagged. The applicant will be unable to submit the application to NYSED for final review if a required question remains unresolved.

The online application may only be submitted/certified by the chief school officer of the applicant LEA. The designated superintendent (public school LEAs) or the chief executive officer, board of trustees president, or school employee designated by the board of trustees (charter school LEAs), are the only administrators with the submit/certify rights necessary to successfully submit and certify a completed application for NYSED review.

LEAs are NOT REQUIRED to send hard copies of survey materials to the Department.

There has been a single ammendment application provided to the ESSA Program Office and approved by that office on June 6, 2022. This was a minor modification to reclassify money originally designated for COVID testing to increase the allocation for other previously approved categories of expenditure from the original application. As the environment changes to reduce the need to use funding for COVID testing, the ammendment requested and approved moved funding to a catagory of expenditure and purpose of expenditure that had already been approved by the ESSA Program Office and received public comment during the original application process.

As reported previously in the original application for ARP ESSER funding, public presentation and comment on the original ARP ESSER plan was conducted as part of the original applicaitn process. Modification and amendments are discussed in public board meetings where public comment is also available. The ammendment in question did not change the overall purposes or rationale for broad categories of expenditure originally approved.
