SIRS 301-Tested/Not Tested Confirmation Report

About the Report

Students are included on the Tested/Not Tested Confirmation Report if their last regular enrollment record during the school year had an ending date between July 1 and June 30 of the school year. If a student was enrolled during the testing window, that student will be included in district/school where the student was enrolled.

For this report, a regular enrollment record is defined as one of the enrollment entry types listed below:

- 0011 Enrollment in building or grade
- 5544 Transferred in under the ESEA Title I "School in Improvement Status" transfer option
- 0022 Foreign exchange student enrollment in building or grade
- 7000 Transferred in under the ESEA "Persistently Dangerous School" transfer option
- 7011 Transferred in under the ESEA "Victim of Serious Violent Incident" transfer option

The Tested/Not Tested Confirmation Reports (T/NT) are available for the following New York State Testing Program (NYSTP) assessments:

- Grades 3-8 English language arts (ELA)
- Grades 3-8 mathematics
- Grades 5 & 8 science (Grade 8 science only in 2022-23. Prior to 2022-23, Grades 4 & 8 science were administered)
- New York State English as a Second Language Achievement Test (NYSESLAT)
- New York State Alternate Assessment (NYSAA)

Rules for determining eligibility for receiving a valid score and associated Standard Achieve Codes can be found in the [SIRS Manual](#).

Filtering

Entities displayed in the dropdowns are determined by a user's entitlements in SEDDAS. At a minimum, a user must select a "School Year" and "District" to generate the report.

The **District** filter displays the district where the student's last regular enrollment (see list above) was in the selected school year. If there are no students in the district participating in the NYSTP assessments for the selected school year, the district will not display in the dropdown.

The **Location** filter displays all locations that administered the NYSTP assessments within the selected "School Year" and "District." There is also an option to generate a "District Rollup." The "District Rollup" will not include "Location Name" or "Location BEDS Code." By default, the "Location" is set to display "All."

The **Report Subject Area** filter displays all grade levels for students that participated in the NYSTP, NYSAA, or NYSESLAT assessments based on their most recent regular enrollment record, within the selected

“School Year,” “District,” and “Location.” The default for the “Report Subject Area” filter is “All Subject Areas.”

The **Assessment** filter allows the user to view the report for “All Students” for a specific NYSTP, NYSA, or NYSESLAT assessment level within the selected “School Year,” “District,” “Location,” and “Grade.” There is also an option to generate a “Tests Rollup.” The “Tests Rollup” will not include “Assessment Name.” If “All Tests” is selected for “Assessment,” then the “Assessment” column will display. The default for “Assessment” is “Tests Rollup.”

The **Subgroup** filter allows a user to view the report for “All Students” or a selected subgroup. There is also an “All Subgroups” option that displays all subgroups for students that participated in the NYSTP, NYSA, or NYSESLAT assessments within the selected “School Year,” “District,” “Location,” “Report Subject Area,” and “Assessment Level.” The Accountability subgroups are marked by an asterisk. For districts, “Subgroup” defaults to “All Students” and for Charter Schools and Religious and Independent Schools (nonpublics), “Subgroup” defaults to display all subgroups.

Display Ancillary Data allows a user to include additional demographic data in the detail report. See [Additional Variables shown in the detail when the Display Ancillary filter is set to “Yes.”](#)

Summary Report

The columns displayed are dependent on filtering choices to include “School Year,” “Location,” “Report Subject Area,” “Assessment,” and “Display Ancillary Data.”

Location Name: The “Location Name” is the name of the school with reporting responsibility for the student(s). If a specific Subject Area is selected, this column will not be displayed. Please note: “HI – District Name” translates to “Home-Instructed” students and “HB – District Name” translates to “Homebound” students for the corresponding district.

Location BEDS Code: The “Location BEDS Code” corresponds to the school with reporting responsibility for the student(s). If a specific “Subject Area” is selected, this column will not be displayed.

Report Subject Area: The “Report Subject Area” displays all subject areas when all subject areas is selected from the dropdown. If a specific subject area is selected, this column will not be displayed.

Student Subgroup: The count of students for “All Students” or a selected subgroup. The Accountability subgroups are marked by an asterisk.

Tested

Level 1: The sum of students who received a “Level 1” standard achieved code, as applicable for the assessment taken.

Level 2: The sum of students who received a “Level 2” standard achieved code, as applicable for the assessment taken.

Level 3: The sum of students who received a “Level 3” standard achieved code, as applicable for the assessment taken.

Level 4: The sum of students who received a “Level 4” standard achieved code, as applicable for the assessment taken.

Level 5: The sum of students who received a “Level 5” standard achieved code, as applicable for the assessment taken.

No Performance Level: The sum of students awaiting a score to be provided by the testing contractor.

Total Tested: The sum of students who received valid score on the assessment listed and received a performance level of “Level 1,” “Level 2,” “Level 3,” “Level 4,” or “Level 5” as applicable.

Mean Score: The average scale score is based on the students who received a valid scale score. Mean scores are calculated for public schools and districts, and only for NYSTP ELA, Mathematics and Science only.

PHE Exempt: The sum of students reported as a Public Health Event for the assessment. (Displayed only for school years when applicable.)

Not Tested

RERI (Receiving Entirely Remote Instruction): The sum of students reported with a standard achieved code of “92.” (Displayed only for school years when applicable.)

Medically Excused: The sum of students reported with a standard achieved code “93.”

Administrative Error: The sum of students reported with a standard achieved code “97.”

AETI (Administrative Error Technical Issues – applicable only to CBT assessments): The sum of students reported with a standard achieved code “90.” (Displayed only for school years when applicable.)

Refusal: The sum of students reported with a standard achieved code “96.”

Absent/No Valid Score: The sum of students that did not meet the validity rules for achieving a valid score.

Incomplete: The sum of students not submitted to the testing contractor for scoring (e.g. an Assessment Fact record was submitted without an Assessment Response record). (Displayed only for school years when applicable.)

No Assessment: The sum of students enrolled during the testing period without an Assessment Fact or an Assessment Response record. (Students using the Regents waiver will count as Not Tested and appear under the “No Assessment” column for NYSTP Mathematics.)

ELA/Math Enrollment Grade Level not equal to Assessment Grade Level: The sum of students who are enrolled in the selected grade but took an ELA or math assessment for a different grade.

Total Not Tested: The sum of students in columns “Medically Excused,” “Administrative Error,” “Refusal,” “No Valid Score,” “Incomplete,” “No Assessment,” and “ELA/Math Enrollment Grade Level not equal to Assessment Grade Level.”

Total Tested + Total Not Tested: The sum of students in columns “Total Tested” and “Total Not Tested.”

Informational

Assessment Taken in Lieu of or Additional to the NYSTP ELA/Math/Science Assessment: The column displays the count of students who either took another assessment in lieu of a NYSTP assessment or took an assessment in addition to the NYSTP assessment. Students with a “Standard Achieved” of “Level 1,” “Level 2,” “Level 3,” or “Level 4” are included in the “Total Tested” counts and under the performance level displayed. All others are included in the “Total Not Tested” counts and under the not tested standard achieved displayed. Only one assessment will be displayed here. The assessments populating this column are selected in the following order: Regents, NYSESLAT, NYSA.

Science Enrollment Grade Level not equal to Assessment Grade Level: The sum of students who took a grade 5 science or grade 8 science assessment but are not enrolled in grade 5 or 8. Students are excluded from “Tested” and “Not Tested” counts.

Student Detail Report

The student detail report provides a list of students who are included in the aggregate count on the summary report. To see additional demographic data, a user needs to change the “Display Ancillary Data” filter to “Yes.” Additional information about the terms and service codes used may be found in the [SIRS Manual](#).

Assessment Description: Indicates the specific grade and assessment administered to the student.

Student ID, NYSSIS ID, Student, Enrollment Grade, and Grade Equivalent: Reported as of June 30 of the reporting year or the date of last enrollment record, if prior to June 30.

Location: School building name based on the students most recent enrollment record.

Grade Mismatch: An “X” will be displayed when the “Grade Equivalent” is not the same as the grade level of the assessment taken.

Standard Achieved: The achievement level received by the student based on the student’s total score. Information about each assessment’s Standard Achieved Levels is available in the [SIRS Manual](#).

Score: The score that the student achieved on the assessment taken.

Additional fields will be displayed, as applicable, for the assessments listed below:

3-8 ELA & Mathematics

Platform: Identifies the testing method; Paper Based Testing (PBT) or Computer Based Testing (CBT).

CBT Not Tested Reason: The description of why the student wasn’t tested if applicable.

NYSESLAT

NYSESLAT Listening Subscore: Student’s score in Listening modality.

NYSESLAT Speaking Subscore: Student’s score in Speaking modality.

NYSESLAT Reading Subscore: Student's score in Reading modality (Except Level I, Kindergarten).

NYSESLAT Writing Subscore: Student's score in Writing modality (Except Level I, Kindergarten).

Additional Variables shown in the detail when the Display Ancillary filer is set to "Yes."

Gender: Student gender reported as of June 30 of the reporting year or the date of last enrollment record, if prior to June 30.

Ethnicity: Students reported with Yes for Hispanic/Latino ethnicity indicator are shown as Hispanic. Students reported with No for Hispanic/Latino ethnicity indicator are shown as the ethnicity indicated by the "Race Code" reported. If multiple race codes are reported for a non-Hispanic/Latino student, the student is shown as Multiracial.

Economically Disadvantaged: This field will display "YES" for students with a Program service code 0198.

ELL Eligible: This field will display "YES" for students with a Program service code 0231.

Former ELL: This field will display "YES" for students who are not identified as ELL eligible (reported with a Program service code of 0231) in the current school year but who were identified as ELL eligible in at least one of the previous four school years.

ELL Duration: Describes where a student is along the continuum of English language acquisition (Newcomer, Developing, Longterm) based on the number of years the student has been receiving ELL services in New York State.

NYSESLAT Eligible: A "YES" in this column indicates students who were reported with a program service code 0242.

SWD (Students with a Disability): This field will display "YES" for students with one of the following program service codes: 5786, 0352, 0363, 0385, 0396, 0407, 0418, 0429, 0440, 0451, 0462, 0473, 0484, or 0495.

Former SWD: A "YES" in this column indicates students who were reported with a disability program service code anytime in the school year in at least one of the two previous reporting years but not at any time in the current reporting year.

NYSAA Eligible: A "YES" in this column indicates students reported with program service code 0220 (Eligible for Alternate Assessment), indicating that the student is eligible to take the New York State Alternate Assessment to fulfill the participation and performance requirements for ELA and mathematics accountability.

Homeless: This field will display "YES" for students with a program service code 8262 and a Primary Nighttime Residence Code of D, H, S, T or U.

In Foster Care: This field will display "YES" for students with a program service code 8300.

Parent In Armed Forces: This field will display "YES" for students with a program service code 8292.

Immigrant: This field will display “YES” for students with a program service code 8282.

Crisis/Disaster Student Displacement Code: The code reported in the school year in which the impacted student is first presented at the school for registration.

Crisis Name: The name of the crisis or disaster that led to the student being displaced.
