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

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1. Demonstrable Improvement (DI) Determinations Process

DI Determinations

- Schools under Receivership must annually demonstrate improvement based upon an index that combines NYSED's ESSA accountability indicators with other locally chosen indicators.
- Schools may exit Receivership in June of the year that they exit their CSI support model.



How is a DI Index computed?

Level	Selected By	Example Indicators	Sum of Weights
Level 1	NYSED	 ELA PI (All Students) Student Growth (All Students) 4yr Grad Rate (All Students) 	50
Level 2	School	 Attendance (SWD) Student Growth (White) Teacher Attendance 	50

• DI Index = Sum of Weights of Level 1 Indicator Targets Met + Sum of Weights of Level 2 Indicator Targets Met



How is a preliminary DI determination made?

DI Index	Preliminary DI Determination	What Happens Next?	
≥ 67%	Made DI	Schools will continue to operate under the authority of the Superintendent Receiver and implement their approved Continuation Plan for the 2025–26 school year.	
40% to < 67%	Commissioner's Decision	Additional information will be provided to inform the Commissioner's decision.	
< 40%	Did Not Make DI	Schools may be transitioned from Superintendent Receivership to Independent Receivership, closed, or placed under preliminary registration review, risking registration revocation.

DI Reporting Timeline

Due Date	Reporting Requirement		
July 21, 2025*	Schools with indicator #5, School Safety, must submit School Safety and Educational Climate (SSEC) data through the Information and Reporting Services (IRS) Data Exchange (IDEx).		
August 15, 2025	Districts must submit final, end-of-year data to Level 2 of SIRS in accordance with the guidance from IRS.**		
August 29, 2025	Schools with approved local indicators must submit results to <u>accountinfo@nysed.gov.</u>		
October 17, 2025 Schools with total cohort 4-year, 5-year, and 6-year graduation rate indicators #70-75, #88-93, and #250-2 must submit August graduates data to Level 2 of SIR

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3. Office of Innovation and School Reform (OISR) Support and Reporting Requirements

End of Year Reporting and Improvement Planning for Schools under Receivership

To close out the 2024–25 school year, schools under Receivership are required to submit a *2024–25 Quarter 4 Report and 2025–26 Continuation Plan*. The completed document is due by July 21, 2025.

This single document serves as both:

A Quarter 4 report on the outcomes resulting from the implementation of strategies and actions outlined in the school's 2024–2025 improvement.

A comprehensive plan to advance a continuum of school improvement that results in meeting or exceeding demonstrable improvement (DI) targets during the 2025–2026 school year.

Instructions

After the Continuation Plan has been finalized, representatives from the school should work with district leadership and staff to determine how best to leverage Title I, 1003 School Improvement Grant (SIG) funding and SIG Targeted Funding for schools under Receivership to implement the Lead Strategies outlined.

- Each school will also complete a 2025–2026 SIG Expenditure Plan as an addendum to the 2024–25 Quarter 4 Report and 2025–26 Continuation Plan.
 - For 2025–2026, Targeted SIG funding will be allocated directly to schools under Receivership and will be combined with SIG Basic funding as a consolidated allocation in a single application.
