

A Look At SCDN

The Staff/Curriculum Development Network of New York State (SCDN) has existed as an extension of the District Superintendents since 1986.

Although originally funded by the State Education Department (SED) as the operational arm of the Offices of Curriculum and Assessment, the Network has been self-sustaining for more than fifteen years and is governed according to its own by-laws and protocols. In effect, SCDN is the instructional leadership arm of the thirty-seven Boards of Cooperative Educational Services (BOCES) and the Big Cities in New York State.



SCDN Mission and Vision

- <u>Mission</u>: The SCDN will strengthen BOCES/Big Five school districts' capacity to promote student success in a variety of ways including the attainment of the New York State Standards by supporting New York State Education Department (SED) initiatives, providing updated educational information and resources through networking, collaboration, and partnerships.
- Vision: To ensure success for ALL learners in New York State.





The BOCES District Superintendents and the Big Five Superintendents appoint representatives to serve as voting members of SCDN. Alternates or additional staff may attend from each BOCES or the Big Five Districts, with the understanding that only the appointed member may vote and all fees associated with participation are the responsibilities of the guest/alternate.



Governance

- BOCES and Big Cities may register multiple members; one BOCES or Big City member serves as a voting member (voting occurs on budget and ByLaws annually).
- An Executive Committee made up of representatives from BOCES Joint Management Teams (JMTs) and the collection of Big Cities, helps to chart a course for SCDN development and growth.

- Members gather four times per year for quarterly meetings. These 1.5
 day meetings involve learning sessions (this year focused on
 transformative leadership), regional conversations, and learning in
 partnership with the New York State Education Department.

- Members provide their BOCES or Big City with updates and information from these meetings and share with their component district constituents.

You can easily resize these resources without losing quality. To change the color, just



In Google Slides, you can also use Flaticon's extension, allowing you to customize and add




