

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IDEA SPP/APR

- IDEA requires each state to develop an SPP/APR that evaluates the state's efforts to implement the requirements and purposes of the IDEA and describes how the state will improve its implementation.
- States must report annually on their progress against the targets in their SPP/APR.
- A new SPP/APR is developed at least every six years.





Annual IDEA Determinations

The U.S. Department of Education's (USDE) Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP) uses information from the SPP/APR and other data and public information to annually determine if the state:

Results Driven Accountability

OSEP accountability framework, called Results Driven Accountability, brings into focus the educational results and functional outcomes for children with disabilities while balancing those results with the compliance requirements of the IDEA.

New SPP/APR Package (FFY 2020-2025)

- Next year's FFY 2020 SPP/APR submission (due February 2022) will be the first year in the new six-year cycle.
- Targets must be set for all results indicators for all 6 years of the SPP/APR cycle.
- In setting targets, the State must describe its stakeholder input process in the SPP/APR.

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Stakeholder Engagement

In the FFY 2020 submission, NYS must include a description of stakeholder input on its targets, including:

- How parents were engaged in target setting, analyzing data, developing improvement strategies, and evaluating progress;
- Number of parents engaged in these activities;
- What the State has done to increase parent capacity to support State activities around improving student outcomes;
- Mechanisms and timelines for public input; and
- Mechanisms and timelines for making results publicly available.



Stakeholder Engagement: Target Setting

- The New York State Education Department's (NYSED)
 Office of Special Education (OSE) will be engaging
 stakeholders, with a focus on engaging diverse groups of
 parents, to obtain input on:
 - •Setting targets for indicators for which new targets are needed for the new 6-year cycle; and
 - •Improvement strategies for all 17 indicators.



Requirements for Results Indicators

Targets set by the State for results indicators must:

- Be rigorous, yet achievable;
- Show improvement over baseline; and
- •Be set with the advice of stakeholders



Improvement Strategies

- NYSED currently has in place a variety of initiatives designed to improve both the provision of services and results for students with disabilities.
- NYSED will also be seeking stakeholder input on the development of strategies to support improved results for students with disabilities



Stakeholder Input Process

- **Summer 2021** NYSED will post indicator specific summaries and webinars to help stakeholders identify which discussions they would like to join.
- **Summer 2021** NYSED will post indicator specific online surveys to solicit broad stakeholder input.
- Fall 2021 NYSED will conduct virtual meetings with stakeholder groups.
