

Vehicle and Traffic Infraction

Reporting and Classification Guidance

Introduction

This vehicle and traffic incident infraction guidance, developed by the New York State Justice Center for the Protection of People with Special Needs, is intended to assist mandated reporters in determining whether an incident involving vehicles is reportable to the Justice Center. The attached chart is not an exhaustive list of reportable incidents but rather is intended to provide general guidance on what is reportable to the Justice Center.

If you are a mandated reporter and have reasonable cause to suspect that a reportable incident has occurred and that it was committed by a custodian, you must report it to the Justice Center immediately upon discovery. Custodians are individuals who are employed by, or volunteer at, state operated, licensed or certified facilities or agencies under the Justice Center's jurisdiction. Consultants, volunteers or contractors of organizations or companies that contract with facilities and agencies under the Justice Center's jurisdiction are also considered to be custodians if they have regular and substantial contact with a service recipient.

Classification and Assignment

The chart below is used by the New York State Justice Center (NYJC) when classifying vehicle and traffic incidents reported to the NYJC. Incidents are classified as Abuse/Neglect (A/N) or Significant Incident (SI). All allegations of abuse and neglect are investigated by the NYJC or the State Oversight Agency (SOA) responsible for licensing or certifying the provider agency. The NYJC determines assignment for the investigation of abuse and neglect allegations based on the severity of the allegation.

Common Traffic Violations

- Speeding
- · Reckless driving
- Failed to stop for a school bus
- Inadequate brakes
- Improper cell phone use
- Following too closely
- Passing improperly, changing lanes unsafely, driving to the left of center, driving in the wrong direction
- Failed to obey a traffic signal, a stop sign, or a yield sign
- · Railroad crossing violation
- Includes property damage or the injury of a domestic animal
- · Other moving violations
- Use of portable electronic device ("texting") includes cell phones and handheld GPS
- Failed to yield the right-of-way
- Passenger safety violation, including seat belt and child safety seat violations for passengers under the age of 16
- Left the scene of an accident that includes property damage or the injury of a domestic animal
- DUI/DWI
