#### Accepted First Aid, CPR, AED, and Concussion Certifications for Coaches

Regardless of the experience or teaching certificates a person may have, <u>State Education</u> <u>Law, Article (6)</u>, <u>Section 3001b</u>, requires that a person appointed as a coach of an interschool athletic team must hold a valid certificate of completion of a course of study in first aid knowledge and skills offered by a nationally recognized organization, as defined in public health law <u>Section 3000-B(1)(d)</u>, or an equivalent experience which is approved by the commissioner of Education. Before each sports season begins, coaches must provide valid evidence to their school district that they possess up-to-date knowledge and skills in first aid, CPR, and Concussion Management.

It is the responsibility of the board of education to appoint only coaches who meet the requirements as outlined in the Regulation of the Commissioner of Education. The chief school officer has the responsibility to ensure that all coaches, once appointed by the board of education, complete the necessary courses, to determine that the coaches are keeping their first aid skill and knowledge current and are complying with the coaching requirements. Each school district must keep permanent records on persons who have been and are currently coaching in the district. It is recommended that the director of physical education and athletics maintain these records. Information on the current coaching staff should be listed in the School District Plan for Physical Education.

#### **Special Considerations:**

The following professionals do not need to submit a valid First Aid course certificate as part of their coaching license application. However, they will need to submit a valid CPR/AED certificate for their application:

- Certified Emergency Medical Technicians (EMT) and Paramedic
- Fire & Police Officers (full time)

Individuals holding a NYS PROFESSIONAL LICENSE issued by the Office of the Professions in any of the medical fields identified below can meet the NYS First Aid requirement by submitting verification of their license registration and provide either a current letter of employment or verification of any current first aid course. They will also need to submit a valid CPR/AED certificate for their coaching license application.

- All Nurses (RN, LPN, NP)
- Physician Physician Assistant (MD, DO)
- Certified Athletic Trainer (ATC)
- Dentists (Includes Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons)
- Physical Therapists
- Optometrists

### **Concussion Management Certifications for Coaches**

The Concussion Management and Awareness Act, Chapter 496 of the Laws of 2011, requires that school coaches, physical education teachers, nurses, and certified athletic trainers complete a New York State Education Department (NYSED) approved course on concussions and concussion management every two years.

The following certificates are accepted to meet the Concussion Management requirement for Interscholastic Coaching. Review courses are only accepted with proof of taking the initial course. All cards/certificates must be renewed per the certifying agency requirements.
