**SUBJECT:** Birthdate Ranges for Students with Disabilities Participating in the 2025-26 New York State Alternate Assessment (NYSAA)

Students with disabilities participating in the New York State Alternate Assessment (NYSAA) are assessed according to chronological ages aligned with grade levels. The chart below provides information on the age ranges for students with disabilities participating in the 2025-26 NYSAA. Students should be tested based on their birthdate in the content areas indicated for each grade level. September 1, 2014–August 31, 2015	Grade 5 ELA, Math, and Science	11
September 1, 2013–August 31, 2014	Grade 6 ELA and Math	12
September 1, 2012–August 31, 2013	Grade 7 ELA and Math	13
September 1, 2011–August 31, 2012	Grade 8 ELA, Math, and Science	14
September 1, 2007–August 31, 2008	Secondary-Level ELA, Math, and Science*	18

\*NYSAA-eligible students who do not meet the age criteria above for the secondary level and will be exiting school before they reach their eighteenth birthday **must** take the secondary-level NYSAA before they leave school (i.e., when they are 17 years old).

**Reminder: All NYSAA-eligible students noted in the secondary-level age range above are assigned to the Grade 9 cohort in Educator Portal**, regardless of the actual grade that the student is enrolled in at school. The grade must be 9 in the Educator Portal system.
