SUBJECT: Timeline, collection of 2017-18 school year School Safety and Educational Climate (SSEC)

incident counts and notification of free regional trainings this August

This memo includes important information about reporting School Safety and Educational Climate (SSEC) data. Please share this information with the Dignity Act Coordinator and other appropriate school and district staff.

## Submission of 2017-18 SSEC Data

All public schools and districts, charter schools, and BOCES that were active for any period during the 2017-18 school year are required to submit data regarding School Safety and the Educational Climate to NYSED – even if zero incidents are reported. In addition, all relevant incidents that occurred during the summer months of 2017, including when summer school was in session, must be included when reporting the 2017-18 data.

Additional information, including training materials related to revised incident reporting categories that were implemented during the 2017-18 school year are available on our website, and on the Dignity for All Students Act website.

The SSEC data are collected through an online reporting application, the IRS Data Exchange or "IDEx" that is accessed through the NYSED Application Business Portal (<a href="https://portal.nysed.gov/abp">https://portal.nysed.gov/abp</a>) and will be available to all school districts, public schools, including charter schools, and BOCES **beginning on June 25, 2018**. After the close of the 2017-18 school year data collection window, SSEC data may not be changed.

Because this is a new collection, the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of each Local Education Agency (LEA) as recorded in <a href="SEDREF">SEDREF</a> or the Delegated Account Administrator (DA) must entitle designated school staff to enter data into the application within the State Education Department Delegated Account Management System (SEDDAS). While the CEO of the LEA may entitle school principals or other school staff to enter data, **ONLY the CEO of the district, charter school or BOCES may submit the data and certify its accuracy**. Additional information about entitling staff is below:

- 1. To enter SSEC data for a school, district, or BOCES, an individual must have an account in SEDDAS that is associated with that entity.
- 2. For a public school:
  - a) the CEO of the school district (Super Delegated Administrator or Super DA), or the Delegated/Entitlement Administrator (DAEA) or the Delegated Administrator (DA) may create a new account and delegate access for this application to existing district or school-level users;
  - b) the school district Entitlement Administrator (EA) may delegate access for this application to existing district or school-level users (but cannot create new accounts).
- 3. For a charter school, the CEO of a charter school may create new accounts and delegate access to this application to existing school-level users.
