
Centering Voices: Representation within and through World Language Classrooms

The Office of Bilingual Education and World Languages (OBEWL) of the New York State Education Department (NYSED) presents this first webinar in its 2023 Professional Learning Series: **Centering Voices: Representation within and through World Language Classrooms.** This webinar is offered free of charge for world language educators and administrators working and studying in New York State educational institutions.



Webinar description: In this seminar, participants will consider how the identities of our students and of target language cultures, NYS World Language Standards, and the NYS Culturally Responsive Sustaining Education (CRSE) Framework apply to our instruction as World Language Teachers. We will consider the following:

- What do we mean by identity?
- Who are the marginalized?
- How does this connect with the NYS WL Standards and NYS CRSE Framework?
- How are we considering the identities and voices in our classroom instruction that are seen and unseen?
- How does all of this apply to our instruction?

Registration process: All participants are encouraged to pre-register for this event. Pre-registration will close on January 23rd, 2023; there will be no same-day registrations. Once the registrant's email address has been verified as being from a New York State school, college, or university, an email confirming their registration will be sent. Twenty-four hours prior to the event, all registered individuals will receive login instructions with the link to join the webinar. Only pre-registered attendees will be eligible for a certificate documenting attendance and/or CTLE hours.
