Ask Me a Question: Leveling Up Novices with Question Creation

The Office of Bilingual Education and World Languages (OBEWL) of the New York State Education Department (NYSED) presents this next webinar in its 2025 Professional Learning Series: **Ask Me a Question**. This webinar is offered free of charge for world language educators and administrators working and studying in New York State educational institutions. 1 hour of CTLE credit offered.

Webinar description: Engage students in leveling up from novice to intermediate proficiency and deepening learning by formulating their own questions about thematic real-world topics. A fundamental skill for moving from novice to intermediate is to be able to create questions. This webinar will provide some specific strategies to support students in developing this skill as they aspire towards the intermediate level.

Registration process: All participants are encouraged to pre-register for this event. Pre-registration will close on Friday, November 28, 2025; there will be no same-day registrations. Once the registrant's email address has been verified as being from a New York State school, college, or university, an email confirming their registration will be sent.
